Your generous support of Preschool Pages is helping young children grow their love of reading and learning.


Preschool Pages is Women United's signature program to support the development of early reading competency skills in our very youngest learners... preschoolers.

TEACHERS BRING PRESCHOOL PAGES Programs to life

Preschool Pages teachers select the books, design the activities, recruit the families, and host the programs at their schools. They are Reading Coaches, Media Specialists, Title 1 Coordinators, and more. They make sure that young children and their caregivers experience a positive, engaging and age-appropriate early literacy program that truly grows little readers.

And they do all of this voluntarily, outside their normal school duties.

For many families, this is their very first experience with their future school. Through Preschool Pages, teachers are able to build relationships and welcome families to the school community, setting them up for future success.

When Magee Sexton, Liberty Primary's Preschool Pages teacher, was asked her thoughts on the program, she had this to say:

"Liberty Primary's Preschool Pages program, called Toddler Rock and Read, is something I truly

look forward to each month. It is a highlight for me because it provides the unique opportunity to build meaningful relationships with both the children and their caregivers. It is incredibly rewarding to witness the joy and excitement as families come together to learn and grow. The most special part is seeing caregivers and their children bond over reading, music, and shared activities!"



The teachers also have a front row view of the growth children make through Preschool Pages. They even witness the caregivers bloom. Here are just a few teacher observations:

"My student grew so much over the course of the year! At first, she only wanted to sit in the lap of Mom or Dad. By the end, she was playing with others. She also slowly began interacting more with me while I was reading and would answer questions about the story. I watched her learn to identify shapes, count, learn to retell stories, and imagine. She also started to be comfortable enough to dance. I am so proud of her progress."

"This student has grown so much since the beginning of the year. She is more comfortable interacting with others and is more attentive to the stories and activities."

"This child has not been exposed to many educational experiences before. The mother is trying to work hard with her children."

"My student has really grown this year. He is more engaged and talkative. I even got a hug at the last session! His mom has really come out of her shell and is talkative with other caregivers, especially the ones that are regulars in the program." "The dad did a great job of bringing this child to the program and, overtime, he became more engaged and involved in the Preschool Pages sessions."

"This student has made a lot of progress this year. She began the year with a lot of screaming and crying. Now, she cries very little and participates in activities."

"It was evident that my student became much more comfortable each month. Initially, when asked a question, he would not make eye contact or he would retreat to mom, but as the program progressed, he became much more comfortable."

"My student has grown so much this semester. Her language skills are really good. She loves to answer questions about the story that is read at story time. Her mom began to socialize more and more with the other mothers as the semester progressed. She was very thankful toward staff for the opportunity to bring her children each week. They attended 9 sessions out of 12!"

THROUGH THE EYES OF THE CAREGIVERS

The moms, dads, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and even greatgrandparents who bring their little ones to Preschool Pages see the growth in their children, too.

Take Maverick's mom, Adrian, for example. Adrian was worried about her son. He was reactive and could get angry at times. When her friend and preschool teacher, Caitlin Cummings, suggested taking Maverick to Dacusville Elementary's Preschool Pages program, Toddler Time, it seemed like a good idea.

The first few times, Maverick was a little shy. The more times he attended, the more he blossomed. He made friends and looked forward to going.

The next year, Maverick started 4K at Dacusville Elementary... and his teacher was Ms. Cummings! "We told him it would be like Preschool Pages but all day." He loved it! He knew some of his classmates and that really made him comfortable.

Maverick is now thriving in 5K. Adrian calls him her little old man because he wakes up, reads or

watches the news, and gets himself dressed for school.

"I want my grandson to have positive literacy experiences in a school setting. I hope that he will develop a love of reading and of school."


